

Job description – Alumni Project Intern

Organizational Profile:

Pueblito Canada is an international development agency dedicated to improving the lives of children in Latin America. For almost 35 years Pueblito has been helping the youngsters of Latin America by strengthening communities, safe-guarding rights, and providing the essentials for education, nutrition, and health. Working in partnership with local non-governmental organizations, Pueblito provides capacity building and financial assistance to develop culturally appropriate, innovative programs that benefit children and youth directly. Our programs involve and mobilize the family and community to ensure sustainability.

Description:

The intern will be the artistic lead in Pueblito's Alumni Project which is an attempt by the organization to represent its history and to honour the full spectrum of the community through an art project. The profiles will highlight the ways that past supporters have contributed to transformative education, and children's rights. We envision a series of arts works that blend text and photography. Each piece will tell the story on an individual member of the Pueblito community and will be displayed in both on-line and physical formats.

Our objective is to have at least five completed pieces for display at an art show in early April. We have a modest budget for supplies. This even will be the launch of what we expect to be an-ongoing project.

Responsibilities:

Under the direction of the Vice president and together with another intern who will work will develop the text, the intern will work to develop and show the art work This will include planning, logistics and one-on-one interviews with past supporters.

The internship will run from January-April 2012 at 8-10 hours per week.

Qualifications:

- the ability to work with interviewers and other members of Pueblito Canada to create an artistic vision for the project
- the ability to turn into reality and to represent the material in both digital and physical
- the skills to mount an exhibition
- the ability to meet deadlines and to work within budget parameters
- Excellent communication skills
- Proven skills using both digital and photographic media

Candidates selected for an interview will be expected to present a portfolio of past work.
